




### Jaipur – The Pink City

Landmarks like the Vijay Stambh (Tower of Victory) and Kirti Stambh (Tower of Fame) stand tall, reminding visitors of a spirit that refused to bow down. For the youth, Chittorgarh is not just a fort—it's an epic carved in stone.



#### Eklingji Temple – Spirit of Mewar

Just outside Udaipur lies the Eklingji Temple, an 8th-century shrine dedicated to Lord Shiva. For centuries, it has been the family deity of the rulers of Mewar. With its intricate carvings, serene courtyards, and spiritual atmosphere, Eklingji is a place to experience devotion that continues unbroken to this day.



#### Sanchi Stupa - Monument of Peace

The Great Stupa of Sanchi, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is one of the oldest and most important Buddhist monuments in the world. Built over 2,000 years ago, its stone gateways are covered with carvings that tell the story of the Buddha. Standing here, you don't just see history — you feel the timeless message of peace, compassion, and mindfulness that still resonates today.



#### **Udayagiri Caves** – Rock-Cut Wonders

The Udayagiri Caves, carved in the 5th century, showcase incredible artistry and devotion. The highlight is the massive sculpture of Lord Vishnu's Varaha (boar) avatar, rescuing the Earth from cosmic waters. These caves are not just archaeological sites — they're windows into the Gupta era, where mythology, art, and power merged to create something lasting and awe-inspiring.
